

Feast of Blowing of Trumpets



Yom Teruah

Leviticus 23:23-25

²³ And the LORD spake unto Moses, saying,

²⁴ Speak unto the children of Israel, saying, In the seventh month, in the first day of the month, shall ye have a sabbath, **a memorial of blowing of trumpets**, an holy convocation.

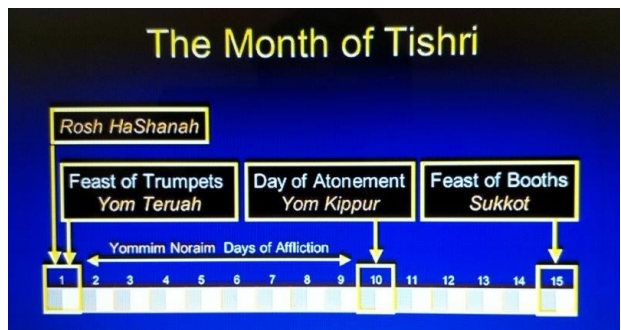
²⁵ Ye shall do no servile work therein: but ye shall offer an offering made by fire unto the LORD.

The feast of trumpets was the first of three feasts in the seventh and final month (Tishri) of the Jewish religious/sacred calendar (see diagram). To which season were these final three feasts related? See Ex 23:14-17. Consider also 1 Cor 15:23, Rev 14:13-20.



What do you think it means in Lev 23:24 that this feast was a ‘memorial’ of trumpet blowing?

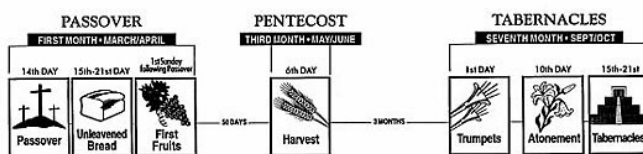
Could it mean looking forward (prophetic) as well as backward (history)?



What were some reasons for trumpets to be blown? (See Num 10:1-10, Ez 33:1-6, Jos 6:4, Ps 81:1-3)

In the New Testament where do we see the blowing of trumpets? Traditionally in Israel the Feast of Trumpets is followed by 10 days of affliction (Yomim Noraim) leading up to the Day of Atonement. What could that represent prophetically?
