
Question 5 How would they of felt while partaking of this feast in there homes? (Psm. 57:7, Psm. 62:5-8, Isaiah 55:11-12)

New Testament Passover Feast

Read Mark 14:12-26, Hebrews 9:18-28 & Heb. 10:10-20. The Lord's Supper is a remembrance of his sacrifice as the perfect Passover Lamb (John 1:29) & the fulfillment of the new covenant between God & man. (Eph. 2:11-18)

The Passover is a yearly feast for the Jews and Easter is the Christian celebration for the same, But wonderfully the Lord's table is a regular reminder of God's everlasting love for us who have believed on Christ our Passover sacrificed for us. (Isaiah 53:5, 7 & 1 Corinth 5:7)

Some Fascinating Facts



★ Mark 14:26. The Hymn they sang during Passover (Hebrew Hallel meaning Praise) is Psm. 113-118. Which includes Psm. 118:22 the stone the builders rejected has become the head stone of the corner (see 1 Peter 2:6) & Vs 26 Blessed be he that comes in the name of the Lord. (See Matt. 21:9). The cup of the Lord's Supper is the third cup of the Passover Feast, The Cup of Redemption (Col. 1:14). The bread of the Lord's Supper is the Afikoman (unleavened Matzo bread) it's broken in two & the larger portion is hidden for the children to find & enjoy as the last thing eaten of the Passover Feast. We can wonderfully enjoy his presence now (1Tim. 6:17) & look forward to the final greater portion yet to come (1 Pet 1:7-8).
